The rule to implement these changes will take effect in January 2014. Therefore, it is essential that Australian companies who have previously worked with the ITAR controls are aware of the EAR controls and the impact on their compliance requirements.

Candace Goforth recently retired as the Director for the Office of Defense Trade Controls Policy (DTCP), the authority for interpretation and implementation of the AECA and ITAR. Candace managed revisions to the ITAR to include export policies related to Dual and Third Country Nationals and the Defense Trade Cooperation Treaties with the UK and Australia. In addition to maintaining the ITAR, Candace oversaw the Commodity Jurisdiction (CJ) Division, which determines whether items are subject to the Department of State (ITAR) or Commerce (EAR).

As Director of DTCP, Candace administered the Department of State's implementation of President Obama's ECR initiative and was intimately involved in the revision of the U.S. Munitions List and the Commerce Control List. Candace was also a key contributor in the drafting of the specially designed definition and the formulation of the transition plan.

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
