EUROCLIO is run by a professional secretariat in The Hague, which is supervised by an international board. This board is elected by those EUROCLIO member organisations that applied for full membership and have a democratic structure themselves.



WHAT WE DO

EUROCLIO promotes innovative and responsible history education through professional development, the development of open education resources, research, advocacy and acting as a hub.

TRAINING

EUROCLIO organises international training courses, active workshops, on-site learning and opportunities for networking. The EUROCLIO Annual Conference is the most international training course for history educators, with usually more than 30 different countries being represented.





The development of Historiana is led by a community of professional volunteers and supported by EUROCLIO and professional web developers (Webtic). Historiana offers access to a variety of resources, such as transnational source collections and ready to use learning activities, but also enables users to create their own eLearning Activities in their own language through easy to use apps designed specifically to help promote historical thinking.
