BARB FROM ST. PETERS, FL asks:



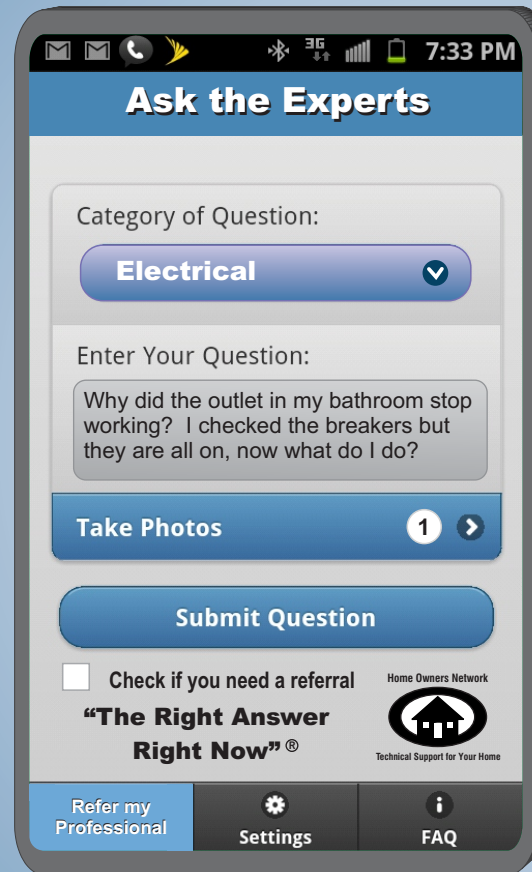
**“What is this valve below my sink, I’ve never seen one before?”**

Hello Barb, thanks for submitting your question. The valve in the photo is a “mixing valve”. Sometimes called a tempering valve, it mixes cold water with hot to achieve the desired temperature, usually less than the 120 degrees that is created by the water heater. It also may be used to raise the temperature of water to a toilet to prevent sweating in the summer in humid climates.
